4 “Completion Rate” is the number of Graduates divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.

5 150% Graduates is the number of students who completed the program within 101-150% of the published program length.

6 150% Completion Rate is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 101-150% of the published program length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published program length period in the reporting calendar year.

3 “Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

4 Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

⁵ For occupations requiring passage of a licensing examination prior to employment, “graduates as employed in the field” means in a single position for which the institution represents its program prepares its graduates within six months of the announcement of the first licensure exam results.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

New students have the right to cancel the enrollment agreement including any equipment such as books, materials, and supplies or any other goods related to the instruction offered in the enrollment agreement, if notice of cancellation is made within seven (7) calendar days (excluding holidays) of enrollment or by the seventh (7th) calendar day following the scheduled program start date, whichever is later.

Students who remain enrolled beyond day 8 will be charged tuition and fees retroactive to day 1 of the program.

Cancellation shall occur when the student gives written notice of cancellation at the address of the College shown below. Students can submit this written notice by mail, hand delivery, or email. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the enrollment agreement. If the student cancels the enrollment agreement, the College will not charge institutional charges; however, the College retains the nonrefundable application fee and may charge for equipment not returned in a timely manner in good condition.
